### ELLSWORTH E. ALBERTSON—(1)

Corporal, 78th Inf.; born at Laurel, Neb., June 3, 1918; son of Mrs. W. H. Hazleton, Mt. Vernon, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Feb. 12, 1918; transferred from Fort Leavenworth, Kan., to Camp Dix, N. J.; promoted from private 1st Class to corporal; served at Arras, Argonne, St. Mihiel and Grand Pres; overseas 8 months; died at Semur, France, Feb. 12, 1919.

### CLARK W. ASH—(2)

Private, Co. F, 168th Inf.; born Aug. 20, 1896; son of Joseph and Katie Ash, Montborne, Wash.; wounded at Battle of Rheims, July 15, 1918; died at Chalons, France, July 16, 1918.

### GLEN THOMPSON BAGLEY—(3)

Seaman, U. S. Navy; born at West Branch, Mich., Feb. 11, 1900; son of William and Elizabeth Bagley; entered service from Snohomish, Wash., May 29, 1918; transferred to Bremerton, Wash.; died of influenza, Oct. 12, 1918, at Bremerton.

### RESSIE R. BUCHANAN—(4)

Private, Co. G, 23d Inf.; born Jan. 9, 1893, at Flat River, Mo.; son of Catherine Windish, Big Lake, Wash.; transferred from Co. F, 161st Inf., to Co. G, 23d Inf.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wash., July 16, 1917; served at Marne-Vaux; instantly killed by a high explosive shell at Battle of Marne, July 3, 1918.

### WILLIAM IRA BRIGHAM—(5)

Private, Co. G, 23d Inf.; born at Big Lake, Wash., April 16, 1902; son of William and Clara Brigham, Montborne, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wash., July, 1917; transferred from Camp Murray, Wash., to Camp Mills, N. Y.; to overseas; killed in Battle of Soissons, July, 1918.

### WILLIAM LEONARD HOLMES—(6)

Private, 14th Inf., Co. D; born at Bellingham, Wash., Nov. 14, 1891; son of William and Lillie Holmes, Montborne, Wash.; entered service from Bellingham, July 28, 1918; transferred from Fort Williams, Seward, Alaska, to Camp Dodge, Ia.; died of pneumonia at Camp Dodge, Ia., Oct. 22, 1918.

### JESSE E. SMITH—(7)

Private, Hdqtrs. Co., 357th Inf., 90th Div.; born in Coffer County, Tenn., Feb. 3, 1894; son of William and Maggie Smith, Lyman, Wash.; entered service from Fairview, Okla., Sept. 19, 1918; transferred from San Antonio, Tex., to Camp Mills, N. Y.; to France; promoted from private to private 1st Class; served at St. Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne; overseas five months; killed at Meuse-Argonne, Oct. 28, 1918.

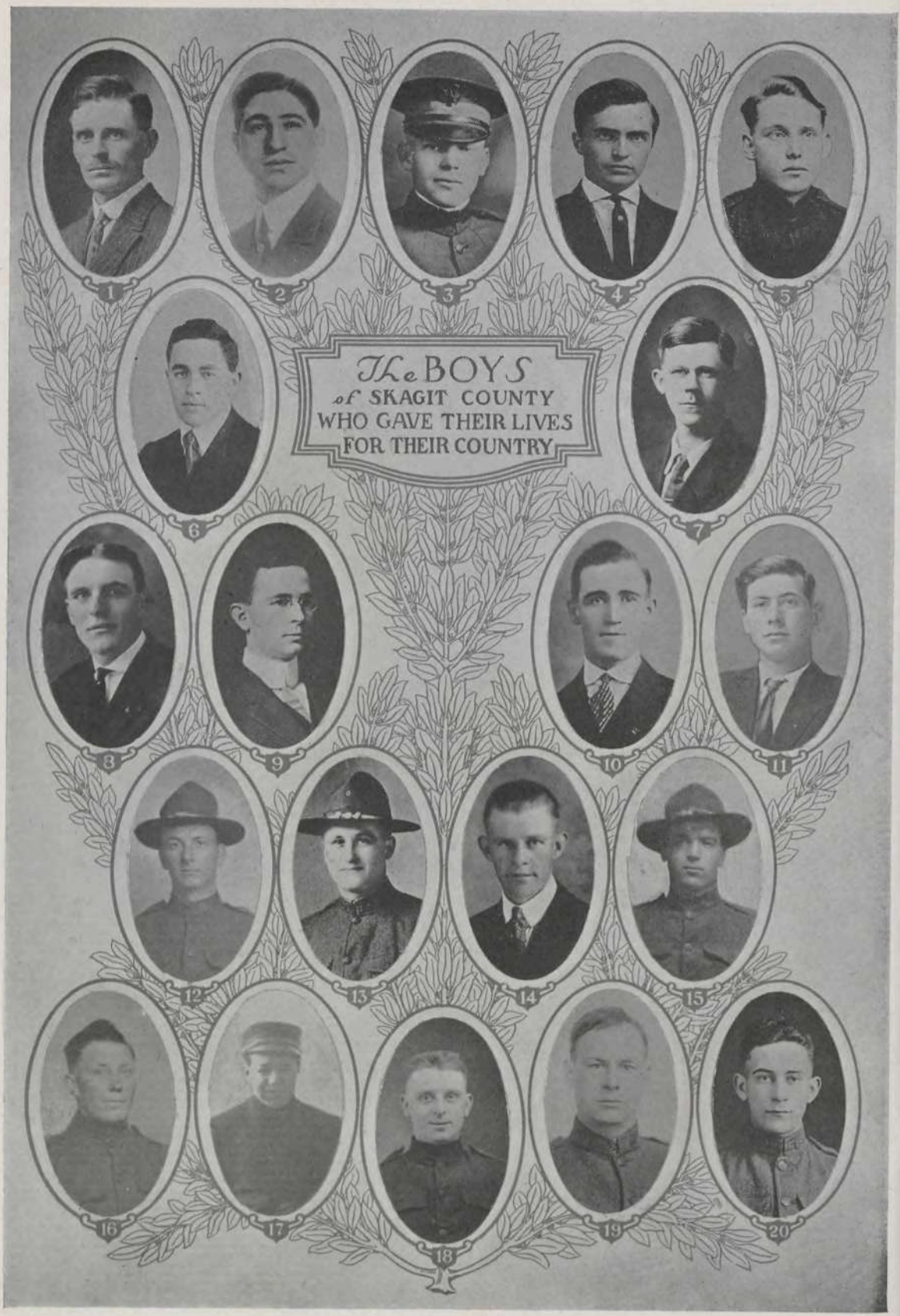

## Who Gave Their Lives For Their Country

### HARRY LEON CAUSLAND—(1)

Private, Co. I, 357th Inf., 90th Div.; born July 22, 1887; son of Frank and Fannie Causland, Anacortes, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wash., June 24, 1918; transferred from Camp Lewis, Wash., to Camp Kearney, Cal.; to Camp Mills, N. Y.; to Camp Merritt, N. J.; to overseas; awarded Distinguished Service Cross posthumously for volunteering to carry ammunition to comrades surrounded by the enemy; killed just as ammunition was delivered; one of Pershing's "One Hundred Immortals"; killed at Battle of Bantheville Hill, Meuse-Argonne offensive; left for overseas Aug. 31, 1918; Causland Post, American Legion, and Causland Park at Anacortes, named in his honor.

### LEO STEVE BRUETT—(2)

2d Lieutenant, Q. M. C.; born at Beresford, S. D., June 2, 1891; son of Mrs. Sarah Secore, Anacortes, Wash.; entered service from Seattle, Wash., Dec. 1, 1917; transferred from Fort Lawton, Wash., to Camp Johnston, Fla.; promoted from private to sergeant, to 2d lieutenant; died of influenza-pneumonia at Camp Johnston, Fla., Oct. 17, 1918.

### ARTHUR E. CARLSON—(3)

2d Lieutenant, 347th M. G. Batn., 91st Div.; born at Astoria, Ore., June 25, 1895; son of Frank R. and Anna Carlson, Anacortes, Wash.; entered service from Seattle, Wash., Aug. 22, 1917; transferred from Seattle to Presidio, Cal.; to Camp Lewis, Wash.; to Camp Mills, N. Y.; to France; promoted student cadet in O. T. S., Presidio, to 2d lieutenant; in action at St. Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne; killed at Battle of Argonne, near Gesnes, Sept. 30, 1918; cited for gallantry in action, G. O. No. 6, Hdqtrs. 91st Div., Jan. 22, 1919; three months overseas.

### HARRY LEWIS GRIMES—(4)

Private, Med. Detachment, 128th Inf., Base Hosp. No. 6; born at Allerton, Ia., Dec. 16, 1891; son of Mr. and Mrs. Grimes, Anacortes, Wash.; entered service from Camp Lewis, Wash., March 22, 1918; killed in action while on the field with stretchers gathering up wounded soldiers, near Juvigny, France, Aug. 31, 1918.

### NATHANEL I. HUDSON—(5)

Private, Med. Corps, Aviation Field No. 2; born at Fresno, Cal., Nov. 27, 1897; son of Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Hudson, Anacortes, Wash.; entered service from Anacortes, Dec. 9, 1917; died of pneumonia at Garden City, N. Y., Oct. 17, 1918.

### EARL CHESTER JENKINS—(6)

Gunner, Oil Tanker, U. S. S. Georgia; born July 13, 1898; served also on U. S. S. Pueblo; died of influenza at Naval Hospital, Brooklyn, N. Y., Oct. 13, 1918, after five round trips across Atlantic.

### CARL HARRY JOHNSON—(7)

Private, Co. C, 305th Inf., 77th Div.; born at Anacortes, Wash., Feb. 15, 1893; son of Charles and Hulda Johnson, Anacortes, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wn., June 26, 1918; transferred from Camp Lewis, Wash., to Camp Mills, N. Y.; to France; served at St. Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne; killed in Battle of Meuse-Argonne, near Autrecourt, France, Nov. 9, 1918.

### CHESTER ARTHUR MUNKS—(8)

Student, A. T. C., Pullman, Wash.; born at Fidalgo, Wash., Nov. 18, 1890; son of William and Olive B. Munks; entered service from Fidalgo, Oct., 1918; appointed special police officer for contingent of men on journey from Mt. Vernon, Wash., to Pullman, Oct. 15, 1918; died from influenza-pneumonia at Pullman, Wash., Nov. 1, 1918.

### FRANK ROBINSON NORVELL—(9)

Private, C. A. C.; born at Fort Worth, Tex., Feb. 13, 1890; son of James W. and Elizabeth A. Norvell, Ames, Ia.; entered service from Anacortes, Wash., Oct. 15, 1918; died at Fort Worden, Wash., Nov. 1, 1918.

### ROBERT FRAZER WARREN—(10)

Private, 6th Batn., 20th Engrs.; born at Antigo, Wis., March 23, 1894; son of Mr. and Mrs. H. F. Warren, Seattle, Wash.; entered service from Seattle, Nov. 20, 1917; drowned when Tuscania was torpedoed, Feb. 5, 1918; buried at Kilnaghton, Scotland, Isle of Islay.

### WALTER AMOS STONE—(11)

Corporal, Co. B, 128th Inf.; born at Ainsworth, Neb., Aug. 14, 1891; son of Mr. and Mrs. H. C. Stone, Bayview, Wn.; entered service from Ainsworth, Neb., 1917; transferred to Camp Funston, Kan.; promoted to corporal in France; expert sharpshooter; died of wounds received in action.

### EDWARD RALPH IRONS—(12)

Private, Co. A, 361st Inf., 91st Div.; born at Saginaw, Mich., May 21, 1893; son of Mr. and Mrs. Irons, Bayview, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wash.; transferred to Camp Lewis, Wash.; to Camp Mills, N. Y.; to France; served in Meuse-Argonne battle; killed in action Oct. 8, 1918; nineteen of his company killed at the same time.

### BARNEY J. TWARDALE—(13)

Private, Hdqtrs. Co., 361st Inf., 91st Div.; born in Norway, Nov. 9, 1894; parents' address, Bow, Wash.; entered service from Seattle, Wash.; transferred to Camp Lewis, Wash.; to France; landed at Havre, July 20, 1918; killed in Battle of Argonne, Oct. 10, 1918, by explosion of shell which was almost a direct hit on gun crew with which he was serving.

### OSCAR THEODORE OMUNDSON—(14)

Private, Co. M, 361st Inf., 91st Div.; born in Medo, Township, Minn., May 26, 1896; son of Omund and Emma Omundson, Detroit, Minn.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wash., April 25, 1918; transferred from Camp Lewis, Wash., to overseas, July 4, 1918; killed near village of Gesnes, in Battle of Argonne, Oct. 9, 1918.

### PAUL RAYMOND HESKETT—(15)

Private, Co. E, 23d Inf.; born at Marshall, Mo., July 16, 1900; son of Frank S. and Lula Heskett (deceased); killed at Battle of Argonne, Sept. 13, 1918; Arnold-Heskett Post, American Legion, Concrete, Wash., named for him and Burton B. Arnold.

### BURTON B. ARNOLD—(16)

Private, Co. E, 59th Inf., 4th Div.; born at Palmer, Neb., March 28, 1888; son of Mr. and Mrs. B. F. Arnold, Grassmere, Wash.; messenger carrying messages and orders to front lines; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wash., Sept. 19, 1917; served at Chateau-Thierry and St. Mihiel; killed at Battle of Argonne, Oct. 5, 1918; Arnold-Heskett Post, American Legion, of Concrete, Wash., named for him and Paul R. Heskett.

### BLAKE CUTHBERT—(17)

Fireman, 1st Class, U. S. S. Marietta; born at Mt. Vernon, Wash., Sept. 1, 1896; son of Andrew and Jennie Cuthbert, Rockport, Wash.; entered service from Spokane, Wn., April 4, 1917; transferred from Bremerton to east coast; to U. S. S. Marietta; promoted from fireman 3d Class to 2d Class, to 1st Class; died in France and buried overseas.

### THOMAS HALE THOMPSON—(18)

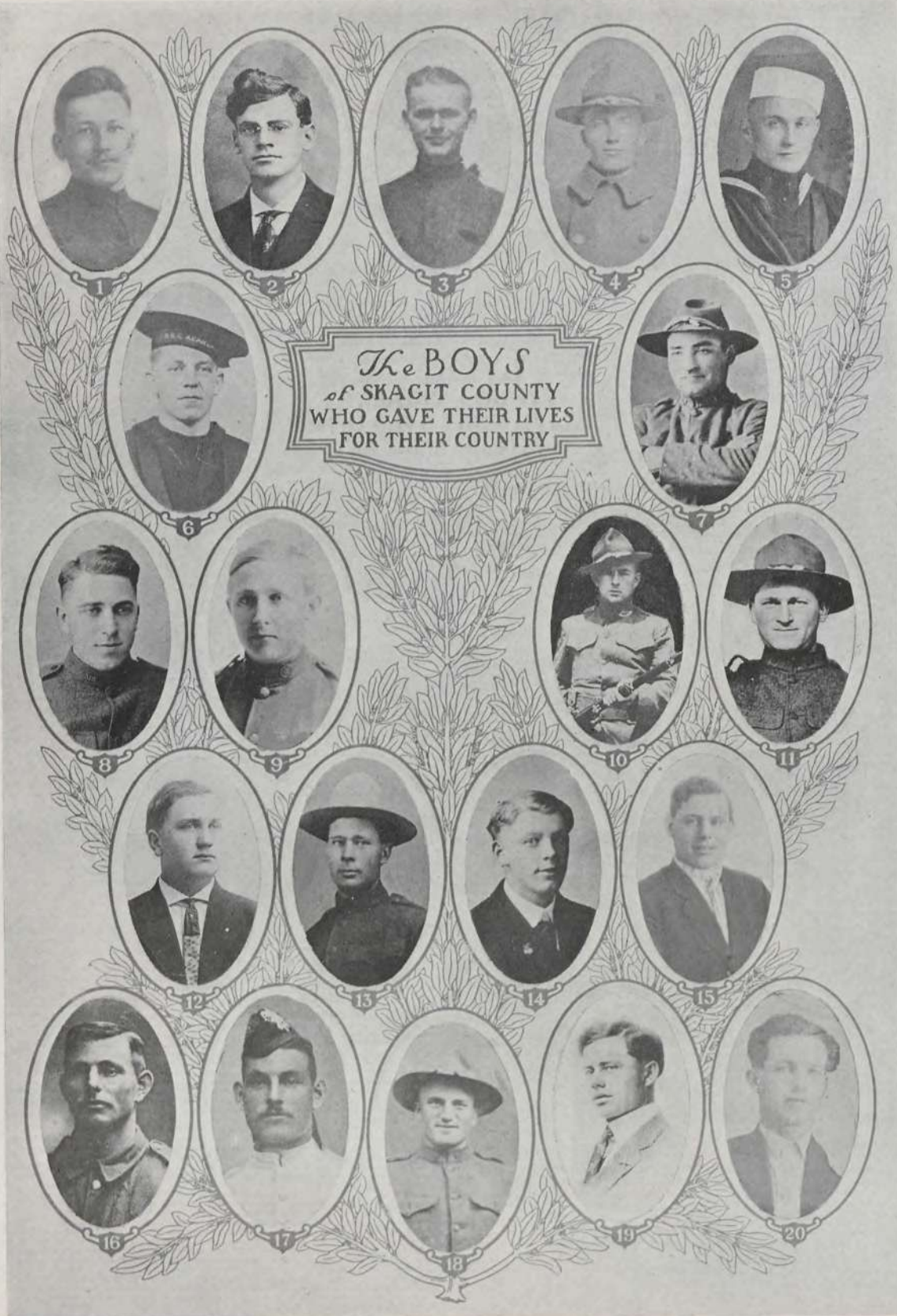
Private, 1st Class, Co. F, 161st Inf.; born at Skagit County, Wash., June 3, 1895; son of Mr. and Mrs. Mary L. Eck, Omak, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wash.; transferred from Co. F, 161st Inf., to Co. B, 2d M. P., 2d Div.; to Co. C, 3d Army M. P.; served in Champagne-Marne defensive, Aisne-Marne offensive, Toul sector, St. Mihiel offensive (army troops), and Meuse-Argonne offensive; with Army of Occupation; 13 months overseas; died at Treves, Germany, Jan. 27, 1919.

### JAMES R. QUEEN—(19)

Private, 1st Class, 28th Co., 20th Engrs.; born in North Carolina, about 1889; son of Mr. and Mrs. Wilson Queen (mother deceased); father's address, Wilmont, N. C.; entered service from Hamilton, Wash., Aug., 1918; transferred from Co. A, 361st Inf., to Co. F, 8th Batn., 20th Engrs., Camp American University, Washington, D. C.; then to 28th Co., 20th Engrs., France; died Dec. 18, 1919, at Aix la Bain, France, while on ten-day furlough; in service about one year and four months.

### NIEL G. HIGHTOWER—(20)

Corporal, Co. F, 361st Inf., 91st Div.; born at Ferry, Mich.; son of Felix and Clara Hightower, Lyman, Wash.; entered service from Lyman, Aug. 19, 1917; transferred to Camp Merritt, N. J., to France; wounded in Battle of Argonne Forest, Sept. 27, 1918, and died from his wounds at Alleuvy, France, Oct. 2, 1918.

## ELMER HERBERT CARLSON—(1)

Private, 1st Class, U. S. Army; born at Ferndale, Wash., June 13, 1895; son of John H. and Anna Carlson, Mt. Vernon; entered service from Mt. Vernon, July 23, 1917; transferred from Camp Lewis, Wash., to Camp Mills, N. Y.; thence overseas, Dec., 1917; killed in Battle of Soissons, July 18, 1918.

## WILLIAM LODWIC FADER—(2)

Private, 8th Brigade, Trench Mortar Baty.; born at Jackson, Minn., Dec. 10, 1888; son of Sam and Mary Fader, Mt. Vernon, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, May 1, 1918; transferred from Vancouver Barracks, Wash., to Camp Fremont, Cal.; to Fort Sill, Okla.; to Camp Mills, N. Y.; to overseas, Oct. 24, 1918; died of pneumonia on board U. S. S. General Grant, en route to France; interred at Mt. Vernon.

## WILLIAM LEOLEN HILLIKER—(3)

Private, 1st Class, Co. F, 161st Inf.; born at Renton, Wash., Feb. 1, 1899; son of Frederick and Sarah Hilliker, Mt. Vernon, Wash.; entered service from Camp Lewis, Wash., June 26, 1917; killed at Battle of St. Mihiel, Sept. 12, 1918.

## ALF MASON—(4)

Private, Co. A, 361st Inf., and Co. I, 39th Inf., 4th Div.; born at Moorhead, Minn., Sept. 22, 1887; son of John and Martha Mason (father deceased); mother's address, Mt. Vernon, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Sept. 19, 1917; transferred from Camp Lewis, Wash., to Camp Greene, N. C.; to overseas May, 1918; served in several battles; killed in Battle of Argonne, Sept. 29, 1918; American Legion Post, Conway, named in his honor.

## JOHN WAYNE McCORMICK—(5)

Seaman, 2d Class, U. S. S. Wyoming; born at Mound Valley, Kan., March 16, 1901; son of Robert and Winnifred McCormick, Mt. Vernon, Wash.; entered service from Seattle, Wash., Sept. 16, 1919; transferred to Bremerton, Wash.; died at Naval Hospital, Bremerton, Nov. 7, 1919, from scarlet fever and pneumonia.

## ROBERT J. McCONKEY—(6)

Fireman, U. S. Navy; born at Arbor Vitae, Wis., Sept. 19, 1893; son of James and Ellen McConkey, Mt. Vernon, Wash.; entered service from Seattle, Wash., July 5, 1917; transferred from Bremerton, Wash., to Norfolk, Va.; to Boston, Mass.; to New York; then aboard ship; served on U. S. S. Kearsage, U. S. S. George Washington, U. S. S. Westbridge and U. S. S. Covington; made three trips across Atlantic; on third trip home U. S. S. Westbridge was torpedoed and sunk, Aug. 15, 1918; was one of four killed; buried at Brest, France.

## WILLIAM PRATHER—(7)

Corporal, Co. L, 9th Inf.; born in Linn County, Kan., 1876; son of Mr. and Mrs. Ira Prather, Mt. Vernon, Wash.; served with Co. F, 161st Inf., and Co. L, 9th Inf.; transferred Aug., 1918; promoted from private to corporal; served at St. Mihiel salient, Mont Blanc, Meuse-Argonne; wounded Nov. 4, 1918; died in hospital, Nov. 8, 1918.

## HENNING L. PETERSON—(8)

Private, 1st Class, 872d Squadron, A. S. F. S., Langley Field, Va.; born in Sweden, Jan. 21, 1896; son of Hans and Ingeborg Peterson, Mt. Vernon, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, March 8, 1918; transferred from Kelly Field, Tex., to Aviation School, St. Paul, Minn.; to Langley Field, Va.; killed in aviation accident at fair grounds, Richmond, Va., Jan. 8, 1919.

## RUSSELL SHERIFF—(9)

Private, Co. M, 23d Inf.; born in Champaign County, Ill., Nov. 24, 1899; son of Mr. and Mrs. George Sheriff, Mt. Vernon, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, with Co. F; killed at Battle of Champagne, France, Oct. 4, 1918.

## GEORGE GARFIELD BALDRIDGE—(10)

Corporal, Co. G, 23d Inf.; born at Hamilton, Wash.; son of Ellen and John Baldrige (mother deceased); father's address, Olfutt, Ky.; entered service from Sedro-Woolley, Wash., Aug. 15, 1916; transferred from Co. F, 161st Inf., 41st Div., to Co. G, 23d Inf., and from Camp Murray, Wn., to Camp Mills, N. Y., to France; promoted from private to corporal; served at Chateau-Thierry and Soissons; killed in Battle of Soissons, July 18, 1918; George Baldrige Post, American Legion, of Sedro-Woolley, Wash., named for him.

## GEORGE T. BISHOP—(11)

Private, Co. D, 5th M. G. Batn., 2d Div.; born at Ellis, Kan., July 30, 1892; son of Elmer W. and Cora A. Bishop, Sedro-Woolley, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wash., in spring of 1918; transferred from Camp Lewis, Wash., to Camp Mills, N. Y.; to England; to France; transferred from Co. L, 162d Inf., 41st Div., 81st Brigade, to M. G. Co.; served at Chateau-Thierry, Soissons, St. Mihiel; killed by direct hit of light artillery shell near Theacourt, in Battle of St. Mihiel, Sept. 12, 1918.

## LEROY EDWARD GERDON—(12)

Seaman, University Naval Training Sta., Seattle, Wash.; born at Vader, Wash., July 1, 1896; son of W. J. and Sarah Gerdon, Edmonds, Wash.; entered service from Sedro-Woolley, Wash., Aug. 30, 1918; died of influenza at University N. T. S., Seattle, Oct. 3, 1918.

## ELMER W. KINSEY—(13)

Private, 1st Class, Co. L, 59th Inf., 4th Div.; born April 17, 1894; son of Mrs. Adaline M. Kinsey; entered service from Grand Junction, Colo., March 5, 1918; killed in action Aug. 10, 1918.

## CARL AUGUST NELSON—(14)

Private, Co. D, 361st Inf., 91st Div.; born in Sweden, 1887; son of Christine and Nels Nelson, Varmland, Sweden; entered service from Sedro-Woolley, Wash., April, 1918; transferred from Camp Lewis, Wash., to overseas; arrived in France last of June, 1918; killed in action at Gesnes, Sept. 29, 1918.

## WILLIAM HENRY SMITH—(15)

Private, Mechanic Div., C. A. C.; born at Winlock, Wash., April, 1894; son of James M. and Julia Smith, Sedro-Woolley, Wash.; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wash., Aug. 14, 1918; transferred from Pullman, Wash., to Fort Lawton, Wash.; died of influenza at Fort Lawton, Wash., Oct. 22, 1918; interred in I. O. O. F. Cemetery, Winlock.

## JAMES REED STEWART—(16)

Private, 2d Batn., Scotch Guards; born at Inverkeillor, Scotland; son of James and Margaret Stewart, Sedro-Woolley, Wash.; entered service March 1, 1916; served during the great German offensive; killed at Battle of Somme, March 27, 1918.

## WILLIAM LOW STEWART—(17)

Private, 2d Batn., Black Watch, Royal Highlanders; born at Inverkeillor, Scotland; son of James and Margaret Stewart, Sedro-Woolley, Wash.; entered service Jan. 7, 1909; died at Marseilles, France, Oct. 13, 1914.

## LEWIS VOGEL—(18)

Private, Co. B, 347th M. G. Batn.; born at Trenton, Mo., Jan. 19, 1889; son of John and Pauline Vogel; entered service from Sedro-Woolley, Wash., April 26, 1918; served at St. Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne; killed at Battle of Meuse-Argonne, near Eppinonville, Sept. 28, 1918.

## HAROLD H. ANDERSON—(19)

Private, 335th Inf.; born in Sweden, Jan. 11, 1896; son of Anders Gustaf and Julia Anderson, Skutsbar, Sweden; entered service from Mt. Vernon, Wash., June 24, 1918; transferred from Camp Lewis, Wash., to Camp Kearney, Cal.; to Camp Mills, N. Y.; to France; died in France, Oct. 10, 1918.

Fireman, 2d Class, U. S. N. R.; born at Redwood City, Cal., Nov. 8, 1896; son of Toussaine and Mary Allain, Redwood City; entered service at Friday Harbor, Wash., Sept. 1; died at University of Washington, Seattle, Wash., Oct. 1, 1918.

### WALTER E. HEIDENREICH—(2)

Radio Service; born at Tacoma, Wash., Dec. 12, 1892; son of Mr. and Mrs. George Heidenreich, Friday Harbor, Wn.; entered service at Friday Harbor, Sept. 7, 1918; died at U. S. Training Camp, Seattle, Wash., Oct. 8, 1918.

### FRED ELLERY HACKETT—(3)

Private, Radio Service (expert telegrapher), 2d Batn., 1st Div.; born at Friday Harbor, Wash., Nov. 7, 1898; son of Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Hackett, Friday Harbor; entered service at Seattle, Wash., June, 1917; transferred from Signal Corps, 116th Batn., 41st Div., to 2d Batn., 1st Div.; sent to France, Nov., 1917; served on several fronts; killed in action near Montdidier, May 1, 1918.

### JOHN MORRIS JONES—(4)

Private, Co. C, 316th Engrs.; born at Decatur, Wash., July 10, 1895; son of John T. and Isabella Jones, Decatur; transferred from Camp Lewis, Wash., to Camp Merritt, N. J.; to overseas, July 6, 1918; served at St. Mihiel, Cambrai; wounded at Meuse-Argonne, Sept. 29, 1918, by machine gun bullet from airplane; was returned to United States Nov. 24, 1918; died from effects of wound at Camp Lewis, Wash., June 6, 1919; cited for bravery in action.

### BUDD CURTISS LARSON—(5)

Private, 1st Class, 361st Inf., Machine Gun Co., 91st Div.; born at Bridgewater, S. D., March 23, 1890; son of Lars C. and Caroline Larson (both deceased); entered service at Camp Lewis, Wash., Sept. 1, 1917; transferred from Camp Lewis to Camp Merritt, N. J.; to France, July 6, 1918; promoted to private 1st Class; served at Avocourt, Epinonville, Epinettes Woods, Baully Woods, Cierges Woods and Gesnes; when ordered to retreat near Epinonville, he, with two others, crawled back into heavy machine gun fire, took down their guns and crawled back with parts; killed at Gesnes, Oct. 11, 1918.

### CHARLES LAWSON—(6)
